Management of the program

1. The program will be managed by the Student Committee.
 - The theme and the details of the program will be discussed and decided by the Student Committee which consists of leaders from each side.
2. Each side selects the Student Committee members.
 - Each side selects 2 or 3 leaders.
 - Committee members will manage the program of each side.
 - Committee members don't have to be English speakers.
3. Student Committee meetings will be held regularly.
 - Student Committee meetings will be held online regularly to decide the details of the program.
 - Multilingual discussions will be promoted using interpretation software, etc.
4. Subcommittee meetings for all participants will be held as necessary.
 - If necessary, small groups (subcommittees) will be set for all participants, and interact and discuss among members in advance.
 - Multilingual discussions will be promoted using interpretation software, etc.

Preparation

1. Each side selects the Student Committee members in advance.
 - Committee members are needed in advance to decide the details of the program.
 - Each side selects 2 or 3 members.
2. **Each participant** prepares one's own ideas according to the theme to discuss
 - There can be any number of ideas according to the theme that you wish to introduce.
3. **Each group (country)** discuss the theme and select 1 excellent idea based on the theme to present at the conference. (Pre-training)
 - Collect all ideas from each student at the beginning.
 - Discuss those ideas among students, and select 1 idea based on the theme
 - Prepare documents for presentation.
 - Photos or drawings or diagrams or videos will be added to the document.
 - Save data as Google Slide or Powerpoint.
 - Screen sharing mode will be used.
 - Presentation should be less than 5 minutes all together. (We keep time for discussion.)
 - Phrases should be simple and short so that translation will be easier.
 - Consider presentation time for translation.
4. **Each group (country)** prepares documents to introduce their region and university.
 - Introduction documents will be shared in advance to save the conference time.
 - Introduce your region and school with photos and diagrams.
 - Presentation at the conference should be less than 10 pages (slides).
5. **Each group (country)** prepare cultural introduction
 - Discuss which cultural performance will be made, and who will perform it.
 - The person in charge will make the necessary preparations.
 - The performance will be 3 minutes long.

6. **Presenters'** selection.
 - Presenters of region & school introduction.
 - Presenters of cultural introduction.
 - Presenters of the theme: a few students.

Conference Rules

1. All participating students are expected to ask questions or express opinions.
2. **Do not criticize other's ideas or opinions** by your own standards. Consider the variety of histories, cultures, custom, events, etc. *Constructive questions or opinions are welcome.

Sequence of communication

Speaker (native language)

→ Translator (English)

→ Translator 1 (native language 1) → Students

→ Translator 2 (native language 2) → Students

Questioner (native language)

→ Translator (English)

→ Translator 1 (native language 1) → Speaker

→ Translator 2 (native language 2) → Speaker

Notes

- Selection will be based on willingness and desire to participate. Students should not be selected according to their English ability only. The aim is not English conversation but to discuss and exchange ideas beyond country borders.

Schedule

1. October: Selection of Student Committee members.
2. October - December: Determination of the details of the program.
 - Details will be discussed and decided by the Student Committee.
 - Details of the schedule will be also decided by the Student Committee.
3. December - January: Call for participants.
 - Prepare posters and documents to call for participants.
 - Also call for volunteer staff.
4. February - April: Subcommittee meetings for all participants.
 - If necessary, subcommittee meetings will be held occasionally.
 - This is for all participants.
5. April 25, 2026 (Saturday) : Main program.
 - Schedule will be set by the Student Committee.
