Greetings	14:30-14:32 (2 min.)	Ice Breaker <all students> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>● Relieve tension.</li> <li>● Share greetings in local languages from each country. <u>*All repeat the phrase.</u></li> </ul>
Introduction of school & region	14:33-14:45 (9 min.) 3 min x 3	Introduction of school and region to each other. (Japan, India, Thailand) <presenters> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>● Each side introduces their school and region briefly.</li> <li>● Introduce with photos, videos or diagrams.</li> <li>● Screen sharing could be used.</li> </ul>
Introduction of culture	14:45-15:00 (9 min.) 3 min x 3	Students introduce their culture. <presenters> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>● They can perform their culture.</li> <li>● For example: dance, music, song, etc.</li> <li>● Other sides ask questions</li> </ul>
Discussion on the theme	15:00-15:50 (45 min) 15 min x 3	Under the theme "What is your good idea to get free from discrimination and prejudice?", We will discuss and exchange ideas together. (Japan, India, Thailand) <presenters>

		<ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>● Present ideas from each side.</li> <li>● Use photos or diagrams or drawings or videos to explain.</li> <li>● Students can present in their <u>native language</u>. (Staff will translate.)</li> <li>● Other sides ask questions</li> <li>● The conference manager leads discussion according to the timetable.</li> </ul>
Break time	15:50-15:55 (3 min.)	3 minutes break.
Free questions	15:55-16:25 (30 min)	<p>Participants can ask <u>any question</u> to each other.</p> <p>&lt;any students&gt;</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>● Topics won't be restricted. (Anime, school life, how you spend weekends &amp; holidays, etc.)</li> <li>● The conference manager leads topics according to the timetable.</li> </ul>
Closing words	16:28-16:30 (2 min)	<p>Leaders of each country will take turns giving closing words.</p> <p><b>*Video call will be disconnected.</b></p>

## Preparation

1. Each student prepares one's own idea(s) for the theme **“What is your good idea to get free from discrimination and prejudice?”** in advance.
  - Consider the discrimination and prejudice you have seen or experienced at school or in your community, as well as those you have seen in newspapers, on TV, or online, and think individually about ideas for how to free yourself from such feelings.
  - Write down the ideas to the work sheet.
  - Ideas should be clear and concrete.
  - You can also introduce great ideas that you learned about through the internet or newspapers or TV program.
  - Write down the ideas as many as you have.
2. Each group (country) discuss the theme and select one or two ideas to present.
  - Collect ideas from each student first.
  - Discuss the theme among students, and select one or two ideas.
  - Prepare slides to present the idea(s).
  - Photos or drawings or diagrams or videos will be added to the slides.

- Presentation slides should be less than 5 pages.
  - Phrases should be simple and short so that translation will be easier.
  - Consider time for translation.
3. **Each group (country)** prepares presentation slides to introduce their region and school.
- Introduction slides will be shared in advance to save the conference time.
  - Introduce your region and school with photos and diagrams.
  - Presentation at the conference should be less than 5 pages.
- \*Japan side introduces general information of schools, because participants are from different schools.
4. **Each group (country)** prepare cultural performance.
- e.g.: dance, music, song, traditional game, etc.
  - Select the performers and prepare for it.
5. **Presenters'** selection.
- Presenters of school introduction: a few students.
  - Presenters of school items: a few students.
  - Presenters of the theme: proper number of students.

### Conference Rules

1. All participating students are expected to ask questions or express opinions.
  2. Do not criticize other's ideas or opinions by your own standards. Consider the variety of histories, cultures, behavior, foods, events etc.
- \*Constructive questions and opinions are welcome.

- **Students shouldn't be selected according to their English skill.** The aim is not English conversation but to discuss and exchange ideas beyond country borders. Please select students according to their ideas and willingness.
